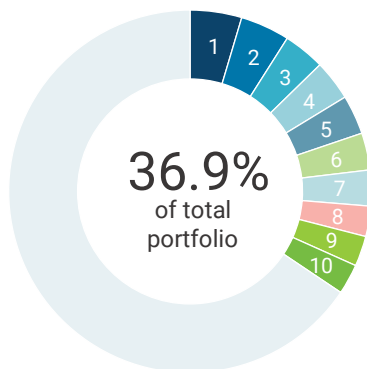

**Composite:** The Composite includes all Mid-Cap Value discretionary accounts. The Mid-Cap Value strategy seeks capital appreciation primarily through investments in equity securities of mid-cap companies and may invest in the securities of small capitalization companies and in foreign (non-U.S.) securities. The typical market cap range of the strategy is consistent with the market cap range of the Russell Midcap<sup>®</sup> Index. Accounts with significant cash flows ( $\geq 10\%$  of beginning of the month assets for the periods January 1, 2006 through December 31, 2010, and  $\geq 25\%$  effective January 1, 2011) are excluded from the respective month's composite calculation and included in the subsequent month. **Indexes:** The Russell Midcap<sup>®</sup> Value Index ("RMidcapV") measures the performance of those Russell Midcap<sup>®</sup> companies with lower price-to-book value ratios and lower forecasted growth values. The Russell Midcap<sup>®</sup> Index ("RMidcap"), an unmanaged index, measures the performance of the 800 smallest companies in the Russell 1000<sup>®</sup> Index. The indexes assume reinvestment of dividends and capital gains, and assumes no management, custody, transaction or other expenses. The value disciplines used in managing the accounts in the Composite may prevent or limit investment in major stocks in the RMidcapV and RMidcap and returns may not be correlated to the indexes.
